

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Woodstock Parent,

In order to provide the best possible camping experience to all our campers, we ask your cooperation with these important issues.

Video Games, Cell Phones and Electronic Devices: Please do not allow your child to bring them to camp! This is not the place for them. We want to “unplug” our campers, and keep them busy with activities they can’t so easily do at home. If some kids bring video games or cell phones, while others follow our request not to, you can well imagine the unnecessary arguments. *Camp staff will collect any electronic devices, and return them on check out day.*

Insect Repellent and Sun Screen: Your child will be outside a large portion of each day. To avoid mosquitoes and ticks, which may carry serious diseases, please pack these items and prepare your child to use them. We train our staff to remind their campers of the importance of sun screen and repellent, please share this responsibility with us.

Junk Food: Please do not bring or send any chips, candy, soda, or any other food to camp. Special arrangements may be made for birthday cakes, although we also provide them. We do not want food in the cabins which brings both rodents and fights to our cabins. The camp trading post offers snacks each day to be eaten outside on picnic tables.

Registration Day Policy: As stated in the Woodstock Bulletin, from 1-2pm, only campers with last names beginning with the letters A-M will be checked in. From 2-3pm, only campers with last names beginning N-Z will be checked in. For more information, please see page 3 of the Woodstock Bulletin.
